

§ 9-701.

The existence of growth of *rosa multiflora*, commonly known as multiflora rose, may be a public and common nuisance on land used for agricultural production.

§ 9-702.

A person who owns land where multiflora rose is grown shall maintain the land in accordance with management techniques prescribed by the Department to prevent the spread of multiflora rose to adjoining property used for agricultural production.

§ 9-703.

On a signed, written complaint to the Secretary by a county resident, the Secretary shall make an investigation to determine the extent of any multiflora rose infestation that violates the provisions of this subtitle.

§ 9-704.

On a determination by the Secretary that a violation of this subtitle exists, the Secretary shall give written notice to the landowner who shall initiate action within 30 days of the written notice to comply with this subtitle.

§ 9-705.

The Secretary may accept, use, or expend any aid, gift, or grant made available from any private or public source to carry out the provisions of this subtitle.
