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

This popular course addresses planning and management issues that pertain to riparian (streamside) ecosystems in a variety of ecological and geographical settings. Emphasis is placed on the ecology, restoration, and stewardship of riparian habitats associated with Civil Works projects and activities. Students receive instruction on functions and ecological importance of riparian zones, conservation needs, potential impacts resulting from various land use practices, and restoration and management techniques that can be applied to improve riparian systems. Field trips are taken to several locations to examine riparian habitats and demonstrate inventory, restoration, and management techniques. Case studies are presented on riparian issues at Civil Works projects and military installations.
